A Missive From Her Excellency Angharat verch Reynulf

Greetings unto the fairest Barony within the Kingdom of An Tir!

With the coming of fall and the changing of the seasons, the Barony's final camping event of the season swiftly approaches, Lord Defenders. With the cycle of the year coming to an end, there is an opportunity to test the mettle, skill, and knowledge of our prospective Defenders, as well as those of our Courtier candidates at Lord Defenders and Sergeant's Trials.

With the Invocation and Investiture of the new Defenders, as well as the Oaths of Fealty or of Service and Support for new Officers, there is also a chance for those Officers or members of the Populace who were unable to attend Court at Autumn War to also give their oaths of fealty or service and support to the Barony of Blatha an Oir.

Fealty can be challenging within the Society. Historically, it was the vows exchanged between liege and vassal, delineating duties, responsibilities and services on both parts, often explicitly to work around if existing oaths might conflict, and was the foundation of feudalism. (A historical example of this would be of Theobald, Count of Champagne, detailing that his vassal's existing oaths to the Duke of Burgundy and to the Count of Auxerre superseded the one to him.) Most prominently, we see this with the oaths of fealty sworn by the Peers and Royal Peers to the Crown and Kingdom, through the King and Queen of An Tir (or Crown and Consort). Landed barons and baronesses also swear fealty directly to the Crown and Kingdom, since Their lands are held by the Grace and Directive of the Crown. Individuals may swear fealty directly to the Crown, when invited to do so at events. Squires, apprentices, proteges, provosts, and arcarii may often swear fealty to the Peer that is their mentor, which may, depending upon the relationship with their Peer, take precedence over any other oath of fealty, as it may be considered their direct link to the Crown. Sergeants, of all persuasions - Heavy, Gallant, Yeoman, Courtier, and Lancer, all swear fealty to the Baroness (or Baron in the case of some Baronies for their Courtiers) at the successful end to their Sergeantry Trials. Oaths of fealty to a Peer or baronial Coronet are often considered to be a direct link in fealty to the Crown, since those Peers and the Coronets are in direct fealty. Landed barons and baronesses specifically are considered to hold the fealty of the populace of Their Lands for the Crown, helpful to those members who may not be able to attend an event due to financial or travel circumstances to swear directly for themselves.

Within Our Barony, the Defenders, Officers, and Populace are offered the choice of partaking in either oaths of fealty or of service and support, in deference to those who may be in direct fealty to the Crown already, or in a teaching relationship as mentioned previously. (CONTINUED)

It is customary that Officers and Defenders be sworn to the Barony, in either fealty or service and support, while Sergeants agree to do so specifically. If you have further questions on what these oaths could mean to you specifically, or about what the different Offices or Defenders tasks may include, please do not hesitate to ask myself, Sheik Yusuf, or Our Seneschal, Elspeth nic Grath, who is in direct fealty to the Crown as a Peer in her Own Right, as well as to the Barony of Blatha an Oir in service and support, which she has done in many areas over the years.

I look forward to feasting and sharing good times to come with all of you.

I bring great news to the Barony.

A paper on how to Create historical Casein Glue
By: Baron Hengist Helgassonne

THE MAKING OF CASEIN GLUE

Casein glue, or cheese glue, has been used for a few thousand years by people all over the world and works very well. The recipe is simple and uses few ingredients. I have seen a few different recipes to make this type of glue, but this is the one that was written down by the Benedictine Monk Theophilus Presbyter in the early 12th century in the manuscript "Theophilus De Diversis Artibus." A google search will bring this up and you'll be able to read it yourself.

In this article I will talk about my experience with making this glue and my use of it.

The ingredients are; skimmed milk, water, vinegar, and slaked lime. You will need a cheese cloth or standard woven (not tight or loose weave) linen cloth for a strainer, a pot to warm the milk and a container to mix the glue.

WARNING: USE AT YOUR OWN RISK: SLAKED LIME IS A CAUSTIC. IT IS MADE FROM BURNED OYSTER SHELLS. ALL SAFETY MEASURES SHOULD BE CONSIDERED WHEN USING THIS PRODUCT INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO; A RESPIRATOR, RUBBER GLOVES, LONG SLEEVE SHIRT AND LONG PANTS, A FACE SHIELD AND PROPER VENTILATION. A BOTTLE OF VINEGAR SHOULD BE ON HAND TO NEUTRALIZE A BURN FROM THE LIME. IF A BURN OCCURS SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION IMMEDIATELY.

DIRECTIONS:

Warm up the skimmed milk, but not to a boil. I suggest using a thermometer, but you don't really need to. Once the milk is warm add vinegar, this will start the process of curdling the milk. Keep the milk and vinegar solution at a temperature pre boil and stir. You will see curds forming. I am told this is the process for making cheese also, hence one of the names. You will know when the process is done by the water being clear(ish) and the milk protein separated into a clump.

Pull out the curd and place in your strainer. Make sure to rinse it well with cold water. If you don't get all the vinegar out of the curd the slaked lime will not work as the acid in the vinegar and the caustic slaked lime will cancel each other out.

Once you have the curd ready put it in your mixing bowl and break it up well. If it's not broken up well you will have lumps and they will cause a hollow, non-sticky point.

Heating the Skim milk and vinegar



Skim milk starts to curdle and the liquid becomes somewhat clear.



Strained through cheese cloth and cleaned with water. Extra water squeezed out.



Slaked lime in powder form

With proper protective gear on, and with all precautions taken, slowly add water and lime. Add a little at a time and stir. Start with small amounts and add more as needed.

You will find that the bowl will warm, and it will start to bubble from the chemical process.

Don't worry, this is normal. The consistency you are looking for is a paste, not unlike Elmer's glue, maybe a bit thicker. If you find that you have pieces of curd that are not melted into the glue, just remove them.

When your paste is to the correct consistency it's ready to use. You can paint it on with a brush and join the pieces you want to glue. Make sure to keep constant pressure on your glued piece for a few days as the glue dries. Dispose of excess glue as it does not last. Clean out bowl with water and a rinse and a final scrub of vinegar.

I prefer this glue over hide glue, which I will talk about in a future article, because casein glue is waterproof. Once it dries, it's hard and sticks well. I have used this glue on a Late Antiquity Shield I am making with great success. I've had to water down a wooden plank shield a few times and the glue has held rawhide cover in place.

Populace Arts and Science demonstration:

We invite all adult members of the populace to show off an item that you have finished creating this year. There will be tokens to place in bowls by each item to vote for your favorite creation.

Class Descriptions:

Newcomers class- Baron Yusuf Ja'bar Timbuktuwwi

We will cover the basic structure of the SCA, courtesy, rank, and how to address someone. Finally we will talk about court and what to do when you are in court.

Viking Whipcord Braiding- HL Kira Mikkeldotter

Class Length: 50 min **Class size:** 6 students

Class materials: \$5 cost for materials to take home after class. If you do not wish to take home materials you can still participate in the class.

Class description: Whipcord braids are a way to make string usually with threads in multiples of four where the threads are interlocked together instead of merely being plied (twisted).

Class objective: To learn to make a four-strand braided cord by yourself using bobbins (clothes pegs) and a cross bar section of wood.

Viking Torc Style Wire Braiding- HL Hakon Thorgeirsson

Class materials: \$10 for bronze, no fee for copper

Class description: Students will have hands on instruction to learn how wire is twisted into a torc bracelet. Students can experience the twisting technique using either copper or bronze. This basic class will be using either a 2x2 or 2x3. Students will have an opportunity to view examples of different torc techniques such as a straight twist torc and reverse twist torc and how the different techniques change the look and design of the finished piece.
